MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT:

On Monday morning my Outlook reminder let me know that Tuesday is National Teacher Day. I thought that I had missed a date and then Google informed me that the first Tuesday in May is National Teacher Day in the United States. The National Education Association describes it as "a day for honoring teachers and recognizing the lasting contributions they make to our lives." "The origins of Teacher Day are murky. Around 1944 Arkansas teacher Mattye Whyte Woodridge began corresponding with political and education leaders about the need for a national day to honor teachers. Woodbridge wrote to Eleanor Roosevelt who in 1953 persuaded the 81st Congress to proclaim a National Teacher Day." I believe that any opportunity to remind ourselves of the contributions that teachers make on a daily basis is an opportunity not to be missed. Take a few moments with each other this week and consider how vital a role we play as we interact with our students and each other. Some of the relational roles we play include: advisor, mediator, facilitator, counselor, advocate, role model and friend. I couldn't find a Canadian study to add to this but one done this year in the States purports that: Almost nine in 10 (88%) of the 1,000 Americans age 18+ who were surveyed said they had a teacher growing up who had a "significant, positive impact" on their life. Nearly all Americans (98%) believe that a good teacher can change the course of a student's life. In fact, outside of immediate family, teachers were seen by Americans as the group that had the greatest, positive impact on their lives growing up, even more so than friends. This is great news and something that we should cut and paste into our plan books as a reminder when things get tough and we are weighed down by the pressures of the day. We do make a difference!
