Others are in the same room wondering about job prospects for the new year---for, as new teachers, many are worried that there will be no work for them in their chosen profession for the coming year and possibly the next. Adding to the mix is the simple fact that the month of June is the most hectic of the year because of the innumerable tasks that have to be completed under strict timelines. I have used the word *amazing* several times this year to describe teachers and I use it again as I, and so many others, see how amazing our staffs are as they go about their daily work with such a positive attitude and due diligence. The teachers of this Local always rise to the occasion. 🙂 I invite you, as community, to take stock of how well you are managing the many stressors in your lives and pat each other on the back for a job well done and how well you support each other.
