Is Your School a **Bottled Water Free Zone?**

"Bottled water: safer and cleaner than tap water, easy on the environment...Maybe not! Look a little deeper and you'll see that these claims don't hold water! In fact, the very opposite is often true. The bottling and selling of water creates a culture where drinking water is viewed as a commodity or a private good---available only to those who can afford to pay for it. In the Global South, sales of bottled water are on the rise. At the same time, water sources are increasingly being privatized. Bottled water should never be viewed as an alternative to safe, accessible public water systems."

As we begin the season of Lent, our Social Justice Committee would like you to consider the following as a Lenten project: Commit to creating a bottled water free zone in your school and your home. Choose tap water over bottled water, whenever possible. We do not want to see two water systems in the future: one for the world's wealthy and one for everyone else!

Greetings everyone and déjà vu!!

A while ago, I mentioned Mr. King's letter regarding his opinion on Catholic education and, in conversations since, I have heard comments like "Forget about it, his letter and opinions hold no water" and "His opinions are dead in the water." I suggest, as I have done before, that this is **not** the case and the flare-up in Morinville could be the tipping point for us all. Newspapers in St. Albert, Morinville, and Edmonton have taken up the charge and with all that is happening provincially and globally, rest assured that this is not simply the "flavor of the day."

I have been following the Morinville case with interest and hopefully you have all taken extra interest in the

opinions being expressed in letters to the various editors. Paula Simons' column in the March 8th edition of the Edmonton Journal, addressed it in these words: "By failing to acknowledge and respond to the changing demographics of Morinville, the Greater St. Albert Catholic Regional Division isn't just discriminating against Morinville's children. The division's uncharitable position undermines the premise of Catholic education itself." The Journal editorial that same day says "an increasing number of people in this ever more diverse country surely wonder why this one faith should have 'grandfathered' special dispensation, and a call on tax dollars they do not fully share"...... I could fill this Local News and others with quotes by folks who do not think about our school system like we do, but suffice it to say that each and everyone one of us should be able to clearly articulate why we deserve to exist as a separate school system and we all need to have the ability to dialogue with anyone who wishes to challenge us.

I have asked this before and I ask again: Can you find time as staffs to gather in community and bring the question of our Catholic schools to the table? This is not an easy discussion to have and we need the information and conviction to debate the Private Members' Bill tabled in the Legislature a couple of weeks ago. *Motion* 597, sponsored by Ken Allred (PC—St Albert), *urges the government "to solicit public opinion on the creation of a single public secular school board."* Additionally, take a look at the letter in the Morinville News of March 7th from Mr. Kirsop, a concerned parent. The debate cannot occur unless we can all look around our staffrooms, schools and our district and be content in our hearts with the way in which we care for each other. Let the conversations begin in earnest.
